

Laguna Hanson Fun Run

- Must bring passport or passport card in order to return to the USA
- This is primitive eco-friendly tent camping. Pack it in/pack it out.
- No facilities: pit toilet nearby, no tables, no running water.
- 5,000 ft /1,200 meter elevation, plan for 30-40°F temps at night
- Bring sense of adventure and be flexible....this is Baja

Suggested Packing List:

Vehicle - tools, spare tire, jack, duct tape, extra belts, tow strap, oil - be fully self contained

air compressor – if planning to air tires down for smoother ride

small bills (1's, 5's, 10's)

bundle of firewood – coordinate with your driver/carpool situation

first aid kit

toilet paper - pit toilets nearby

personal medications – bring prescriptions

shovel

flashlights & extra batteries (each person must have own personal flashlight)

lanterns & LED headlights

tents & tarps (tarps for under the tents or in case of rain)

heavy duty tent stakes for Baja wind

sleeping bag, pillow, sleeping pad, air mattress (pump) or cot

camp chair

fold-up table - no tables are at this location, bring your own

sunglasses, sunscreen, & hats a must!

camera & batteries, battery car charger

binoculars for critter and bird watching

hiking boots a must! (sandals not recommended on these hikes)

Camelpak or other water hydration system to be **hands free**

clothing (think layers) – shorts, wind breaker, comfortable hiking gear, jeans, etc.

cold weather clothes - sweatshirt, jacket, hat & gloves

bug repellent & mosquito coils

book, cards, or games – Lory bringing horseshoes & kite!

musical instruments – guitar, drums, flute, etc.

toys – kite, mountain bike, frisbee

Kitchen Camp Box & Food:

Plastic container boxes work best for gear, food and keeping critters out

Food, beverages & snacks for 3 days – only bring what you will consume.

heavy duty trash bags are a must (**PACK IT IN & PACK IT OUT**)

camp stove and propane

grate or metal grill to cook over fire

kitchen utensils & cutting board

plates, flatware, paper towels, aluminum foil

insulated containers for cold/hot drinks

Water for drinking & cooking – **1 - 2 gallons / 4 - 8 liters per person per day**

WATER transport - suggest heavy duty plastic containers that don't leak on rough Baja roads

ICE – freeze water in plastic bottles or use block ice for ice chest
